


<u>Nursery</u>

Reception


We have been quite busy in Reception this week.

In Literacy we remembered places we had visited on our mini-bus trip and we wrote about our favourite place.



In Numeracy we have been working and adding 2 numbers together and working out the new total using different methods.

We have also used our colour recognition skills to make a daffodil picture of old magazines and other materials.




<u>Year 1</u>

This week we have been creating our own personal badges which show the places, people and things that are important to us. We have also been writing sentences to explain why we choose each area on our badge.

We have been practising our Welsh by asking and answering the question 'Ble rwyt ti'n byw? (Where do you live?)



This week we have been writing our diary entry about our trip to Sea View Farm. We added similes to our writing and we have also learnt to use exclamation marks!



We have been speaking lots of Welsh this week, practising the weather and learning items of clothing. We listened to a Welsh story about Tedi Twt and answered questions about his clothing.



This week Year 3 have been practising when to use commas in a list during our Literacy lessons. In Maths we have been trying to master our division and in PE lessons we have been learning Welsh folk dancing, it was exhausting remembering all the steps, but we had great fun!

What a busy week in year 4! In maths, year 4 have been continuing to improve our understanding of fractions and have focussed on labelling and drawing fraction number lines. In literacy we have been learning all about speech marks which has been very tricky! On Tuesday, we explored Victorian toys and designed our own Victorian toys using recycled materials. We will be starting to make these toys next Tuesday so if your child would like to bring in appropriate recycling for their toy, they are more than welcome to do so!



Year 5 have been busy this week. On Friday we explored lots of artefacts linked to mining. Thank you to Mrs Davies who shared these amazing artefacts with us from when her dad worked as a miner.

The aim of our topic is to create a Welsh Job Centre. We have started by looking at mining, as we have realised that mining was a big part of Welsh industry. It helped to create many of the main areas of industry as trains were used to transport coal by rail to the docks, where it was then transported around the world.

We have also been working hard in maths this week, where we have started to explore a variety of strategies to calculate division. We have looked at ways of chunking and grouping the number to help, as well as being introduced to the bus stop method.

In Literacy we have been working towards our final piece of writing linked to 'Town Is By The Sea'. We have been looking at the features of an informal email so that we are able to write an email from the point of view of our main character recalling the events of his day.













<u>Year 6</u>

January is going by pretty quickly and we are already in the middle of week 3. In maths, we have been learning all about representing and calculating ratio and proportion. We started off by practically investigating with sweets before moving on to written representations.






We have been developing our understanding of using Welsh phrases to say where we are going by playing bingo.
