

This week snack changes, children have had fresh pineapple for fresh fruit and also red peppers with their houmous.








Reception

We can't wait to see what next week brings!


















We have been enjoying our MPCT sessions with Staff Smith. We have been focusing on resilience, team work and reflecting on our feelings. We have been enjoying doing our emoji diaries every session, as well playing the games and building on our skills.

We have been focusing dreams and goals in our Jigsaw lessons. Last week we found out about a variety of jobs that are available today and how much people get paid. Over the next two weeks we will be thinking about what our dream job is and steps we can take to get there. Some of our ideas so far include: YouTuber, Football Manager, Doctor, Teacher and working in a Dog Shelter. It has been fun to think about what we can be and achieve as we get older.



We worked really hard last week to produce a balanced argument about water – a source of good or a force of destruction. After researching information for both sides of the argument we wrote our discussion text at the end of last week. We used the technique of making a point, explaining it and then backing it up with evidence and we are really pleased with the quality of our writing.





We have been learning about different editing features when you share a document with someone, whether you want then to be able to edit, comment or view. It was interesting discussing the reasons behind and benefits of each of these and when each might be most beneficial.
