
We all had a great Christmas and we are looking forward to our new term and new topic. Our topic for this term is 'Farming Through the Ages'.




Year 4 have had a positive first week back after the Christmas break. We thought about what we already know and what we want to know about Victorian schools whilst discussing the types of lessons we can do in the future for our new topic 'School days, School ways'. On Monday, Miss Morris acted like a Victorian teacher for a session and Year 4 found it very different and strict. Following on from this, they have been using a range of information texts to research school in the Victorian times and have completed Venn diagrams with comparisons to Victorian and modern school life. In maths, Year 4 have been focussing on fractions and showing what they already know and understand.

This week we have started our new topic "Working Wales" which was introduced to us on our very first Mission Monday. We are very much looking forward to seeing how Wales has changed over time, especially regarding our local area.

This will take place across the whole afternoon so we will not be doing PE on a Tuesday until after half term.





It is great to see everyone back refreshed after the Christmas holidays ready to embark on a New Year of learning and growing.


On Monday we kicked started our new topic 'At the Waters Edge' with our immersion morning of activities which included a fun water relay challenge outside.
