This week reception has had lots of fun in our new improved outdoor area! We have been playing in the water with problem solving activities such as how to move water from one place to another. In maths we have been comparing height and length, we have been measuring items with blocks to find out who is the tallest or the shortest in the class.

A big well done to everyone who entered the St Davids Day competition last week, you all did a fantastic job with the handwriting, art and home school tasks.

Year 1

The children have been doing lots of oracy work this week on our literacy lessons about the Welsh mythical creature called, the Bwbach. We started the week using an ABC grid to identify all of the important information from the story and yesterday we had a fun game called ping pong where we worked in pairs to bounce facts back and forth.
