


### Reception

### Year 2


There were some amazing compositions completed in our final garage band session. The children have said they really enjoyed their music project and look forward to experimenting with creating pieces of music in the future.



Year 2 have collaboratively written a story about a bunny, using all the skills we have been developing through our narrative story writing journey. Pupils were able to pick apart their writing to identify the onomatopoeia's, similes, and adjectives they had written in the story.



Pupils have also been learning about volume and capacity. They have been able to accurately measure in millilitres and explain what they have measured.




When we return from Easter holidays, we will be studying **Hawaii** as the focus of our culture week. We are looking forward to hula dancing and designing our own totem poles.

#### <u>Year 5</u>

This week we have been coming to the end of our Moletown topic in literacy. We have been working on writing our own news reports including questions for an interview. We have linked this to the text and creatively come up with our own stories for the news report. Some of us chose to look at the overpopulation, so focused on overmining and others created their own newsworthy event.

In maths we are at the end of fractions and decimals topic. We can see how understanding fractions can help us to write decimals and how they are linked.

On Monday this week we did a mission linked to Comic Relief and food waste. We have recently got our own food waste bins in class and have been thinking about ways we can promote this and reduce the amount of food waste we produce as a school. Comic relief have come up with a Lego competition where we needed to design our own product to help with this. As a class we worked on small groups and created our own food bin designs using Lego.

We are really looking forward to our trip to St Fagans tomorrow! This will be a lovely way to end our Cynefin topic of 'Industrial Wales'. Please remember to bring a coat and wear school uniform. We politely ask that children do NOT bring money with them as there won't be time to visit the shop.

### <u>Year 6</u>

We have been learning about solutions in science by dissolving different materials in water to identify which materials are soluble and which are insoluble. We also learnt what the terms solute and solvent meant.









On Thursday we had a fantastic 'First Aid' session in the hall which was led by Miss Parker. We learnt about using CPR and giving compressions and how to put someone into the recovery position. It was really useful being able to practice these skills on each other and using a dummy. We certainly learnt a lot and it is very important to know about these life skills.
