This week is Cultural Week in school and Year 5 are focusing on Japanese culture. We have been working independently to research information about Japan. We have found out lots of interesting facts and anecdotes - did you know it's polite to slurp your noodles?

We have been looking at the climate of Japan and comparing it to Wales. We were given the choice of how to present this - some of us did bar graphs and some of us did line graphs and we chose which area to focus on e.g. Rainfall, hours of sunlight, temperature.

Before we broke up for the Easter holidays, we took part in a really interesting Children's Rights Workshop which explained and clarified that the UNCRC is a list of children's rights that all children and young people, everywhere in the world have, no matter who they are, where they live or what they believe in. We worked in groups to distinguish between wants and needs.
