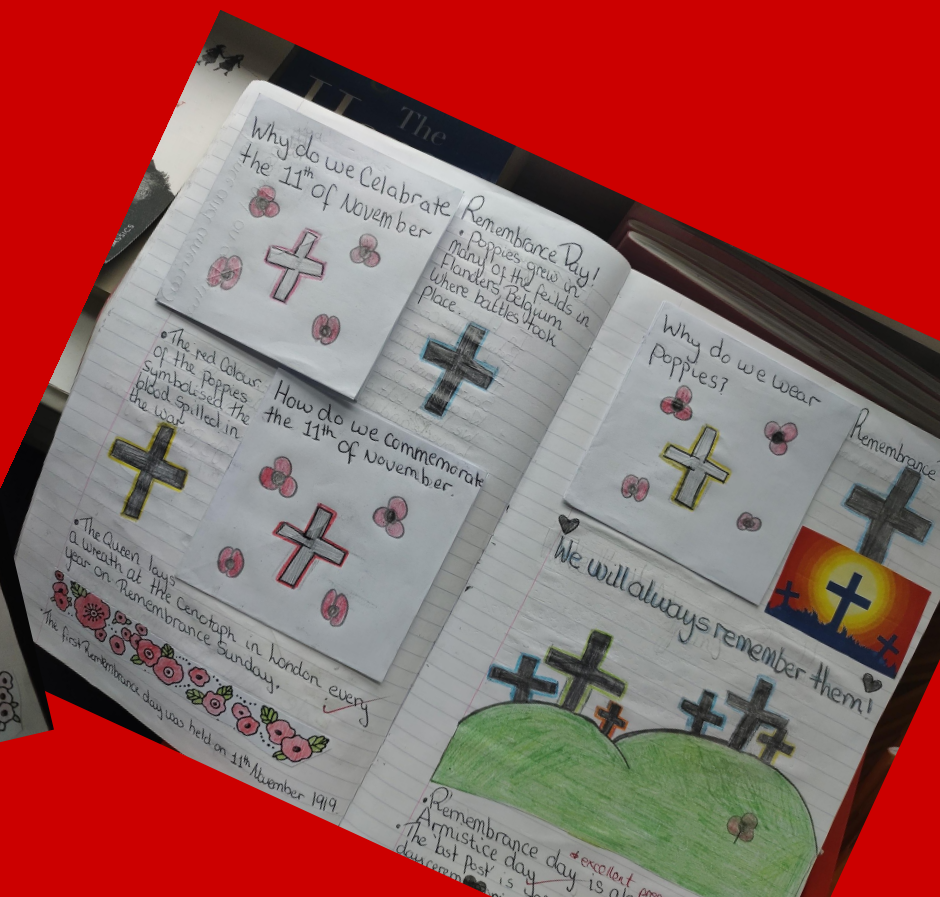
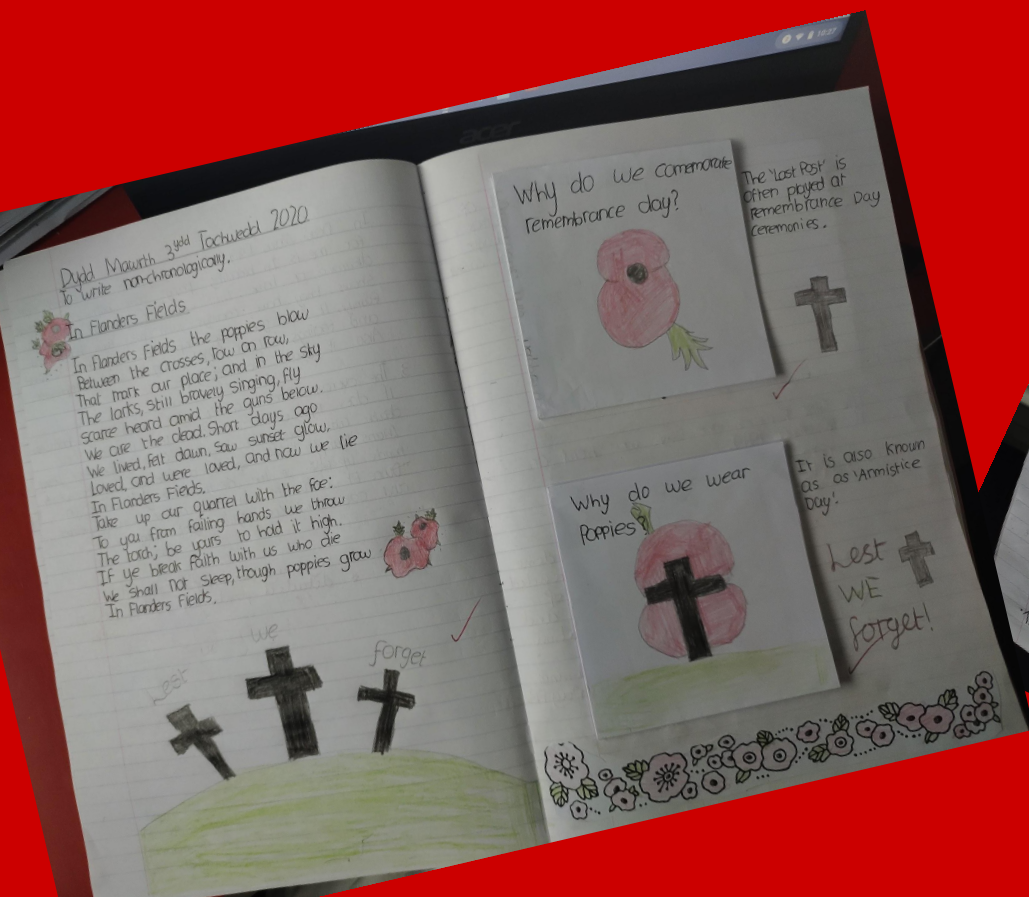
In this

It was such a positive feeling for the people in Ayodhya, as their heroes were right around the corner. Victory lived in them that night. Joy. Positivity. Elation.

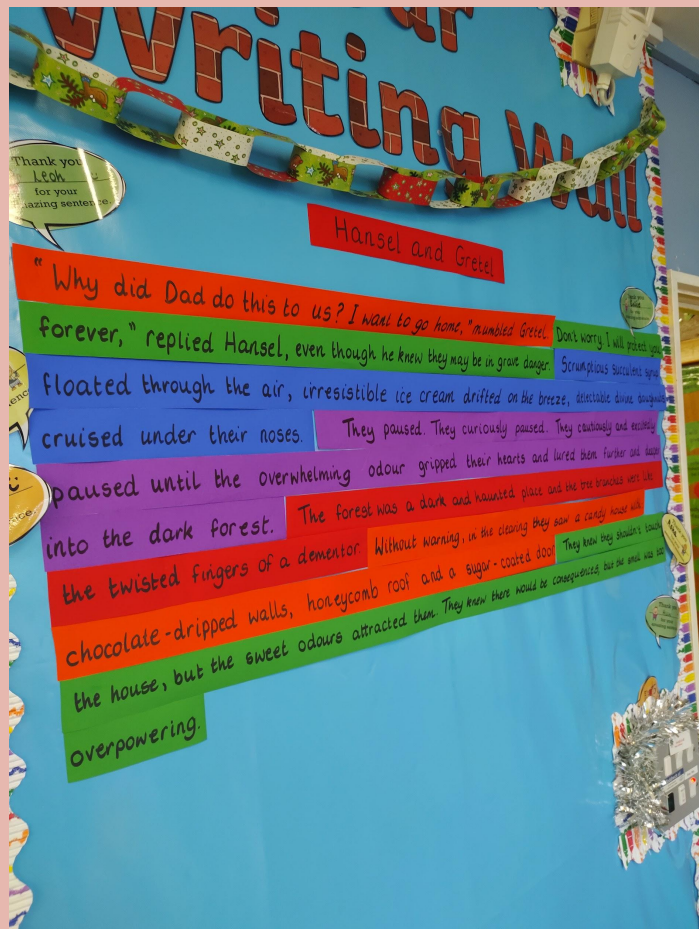

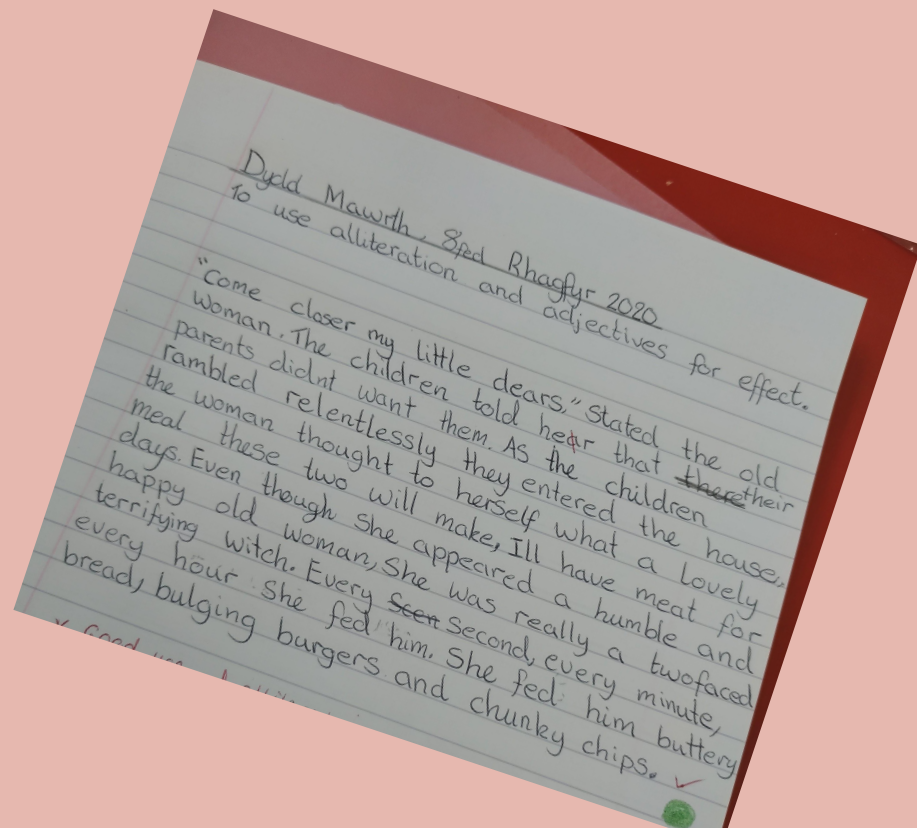
We wrote instructions on how to prepare a healthy food tasting platter, and really enjoyed eating it!
